Staff Background Checks

Criminal Offender Registry Information (CORI) and Sex Offender Registry Information (SORI) checks are performed on every Stonehill Sports Camp staff member. A full health history report is also obtained and reviewed before the first day of camp. Parents have the right to review background information policies, health care policy and discipline policies and procedures at any time.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

Please be advised once camp begins, NO refunds or exchanges will be granted. NO exceptions. All deposits of \$100 are non-refundable. NO exceptions. Withdrawal or cancellation two weeks prior to the first day of camp will result in full refund less the nonrefundable deposit of \$100 per camp session.

To maintain a fun-filled camp experience for both commuter and residential campers, a few policies and procedures must be addressed. In this newsletter, we have outlined information that will help provide a camp environment that is not only a great experience for all campers, but a safe one as well. Dismissal Policies

In the case of Early Dismissal, the coach/counselor and Camp Director must be notified prior to camper dismissal. The camper must follow all guidelines of regular dismissal. There will be no refund for early

Emergency Plan/Protocol

Emergency:

Any severe, life threatening situation requiring immediate medical assessment and treatment.

Medical Emergencies include but are not limited to:

1. Broken Bones
2. Heavy Bleeding
3. Head Injury
4. Continuous Vomiting
5. Loss of Consciousness
6. Cardiac and/or Repertory Arrest

Procedure/Protocol:

1. Staff member immediately contacts the Health Care Supervisor (HCS), Camp Director, and Camp Coordinator.
2. Health Care Supervisor assesses the situation & provides first aid if necessary.
3. HCS will contact the appropriate medical assistance if necessary (i.e. 911, ambulance, physician, etc.).
4. The Camp Coordinator will contact the camper's parent/legal guardian and inform them of the situation.
5. Accurate information will be compiled and a complete incident report will be created and submitted to the board of health.
6. If camper requires emergency transport, a staff member will gather the camper's medical information & accompany the camper to the hospital, remaining with the camper until a parent/legal guardian arrives.

Code of Conduct

All participants taking part in any Stonehill College sports camp are expected to act appropriately at all times. At NO time will staff members tolerate any profanity, rough housing, harassment, fighting, hazing, or any other unacceptable behavior. If any camper disregards the Code of Conduct, they will be verbally warned. If the camper ignores the verbal warning and the behavior persists, a parent/legal guardian will be notified. The Camp Coordinator and/or Camp Director are authorized to dismiss any camper for inappropriate behavior that interferes with camp activities and the safety of other campers and staff. Each situation will be handled on a case-by-case basis. **Campers dismissed from camp for disciplinary reasons will not receive a refund.**

Care of Mildly Ill Campers

In the event that a camper becomes mildly ill:

1. A staff member will contact the Health Care Supervisor (HCS) to assess the situation.
2. The camper will be taken to a designated infirmary area and treated by the HCS and/or camp nurse.
3. The HCS will administer any prescribed medication and care for any minor injury/illness.
4. The HCS will assess the well-being of the camper and decide if the camper's parents should be contacted and if the camper should be sent home.
5. All actions will be documented in the Medical Log Book.

Administration of Medication

All medication taken during camp must be submitted for approval during registration on the first day of each camp. Approved medication will be reviewed and approved by the Health Care Consultant and administered by the Health Care Supervisor. Dates, times and dosages will be recorded in the Medical Log Book. Medication will be stored and refrigerated (when needed) in a safe, secure place. All unused medication will be returned to the parent/legal guardian. **Non-prescription medication will not be dispensed to any camper at any time during camp.**

Lost Key Policy

Any camper that loses their key and/or swipe card will be charged **\$30** to replace each item.

Each Stonehill Sports Camp must and will comply with the regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and be licensed by the local Board of Health (Easton).
